
MARCH WHITETAIL PROPERTY CHECKLIST

Timber Stand Improvement: If you've followed the Forest Built for Deer posts, you will know what YOU want for your land.
Frost Seeding: When the last of the snow is melting, get out there with the switchgrass, clover, and other seed that does well with this process.
Soil Tests: Get them in now so you're not scrambling later.
Lime: It's always the time to lime but immediately following your soil test is a great time to get it done.
Clearings: Get it done once the ground dries just a little and no new growth has started yet. It's 3X the effort after green up.
Predator hunting or trapping: Even if it's something new to you - try it! It's fun and will help reduce the impact on your herd.
